Chautauqua Park Historic District Lighting Design Guidelines

The Landmarks Board of the City of Boulder proposes to adopt a regulation to adopt the Chautauqua Park Historic District Lighting Design Guidelines. The design guidelines will aid in decision-making for exterior lighting proposals within the boundaries of the Chautauqua Historic District, designated as a local historic district and as a National Historic Landmark. The document provides documentation of the historic use of lighting at Chautauqua, assessment of current needs, lighting principles, recommended lighting approaches, and design guidelines. The document was developed in collaboration with the Colorado Chautauqua Association.

This regulation is established to provide guidance for the review of Landmark Alteration Certificate applications for exterior lighting in the Chautauqua Park Historic District to ensure that the alterations will not adversely affect or destroy the historic character or architectural integrity of the historic district and that all changes are consistent with the spirit and purpose of Chapter 9-11, Historic Preservation, of the Boulder Revised Code 1981.
